Asia-Pacific economies to set productivity policy in Tokyo

TOKYO—The 55th Governing Body Meeting (GBM) of the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) will be held in Tokyo, 21–23 May 2013. Approximately 60 delegates comprising APO directors and their advisers from 19 members, along with observers from various national agencies and international organizations such as the ASEAN-Japan Centre, ILO, Southeast Asian Regional Center for Graduate Study and Research in Agriculture, Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific, and Ministry of Science, Industry and Technology of Turkey are expected to attend.

Parliamentary Senior Vice-Minister Masaji Matsuyama, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Japan, will be the guest of honor at the event.

Important GBM agenda items include the annual report of the Secretary-General, the APO revised budget for 2014, a report on the review of the APO membership contribution formula, and selection of a new Secretary-General.
