Objectives	Conduct a benchmarking study on productivity performance of the food and beverage (F&B) sectors in selected cities within and outside APO member economies and provide recommendations to enhance the productivity performance of the F&B sector.
Rationale	APO member economies represent a diverse range of cultural, economic, and social conditions. This diversity provides a rich dataset for benchmarking, allowing businesses to compare themselves against a wide variety of practices and identify opportunities for improvement. Through this benchmarking study, the APO can help its member economies enhance their competitiveness and improve the overall performance of their food service industries against global standards.
	The APO's regional focus can facilitate collaboration and knowledge exchange among member economies. This can lead to the development of regional standards and best practices, promoting harmonization and efficiency within the Asian food service industry.
Background	The F&B sector in APO member economies has been a cornerstone of economic growth and development. This region, known for its rich culinary heritage and diverse food preferences, has witnessed a significant surge in the F&B sector in recent decades, with significant growth due to urbanization, rising incomes, and changing consumer preferences. The growth has created new opportunities for businesses and contributed to economic prosperity across different economies in the region. This research therefore will explore and benchmark the performance of the F&B sector in advanced member economies such as the Republic of China, Japan, the Republic of Korea, and Singapore along with other major cities outside the region.
